MISSIONS FOCUS: James & Sandy Spellman, Ministry to Deaf

Our Missionaries, their health and ministries affected by Covid-19

Over the last 6 months, the Spellmans have had many health challenges but are grateful for all the prayers and support they have continued to receive.

They continue to be a witness as they are able especially to those who have hearing challenges and their families. As much as they appreciate our prayers, they are also prayer warriors as indicated by their diverse prayer requests.

In December, they reported that Jim was recovering from Covid infection. Prayer requests for those affected by the virus and the resulting restrictions on church services and meeting in groups (affecting ministry).

March 2021, the Spellmans continue to be grateful for prayers and support received. They always rejoice at God's goodness to them! Jim has recovered from Covid and they were being vaccinated with minor side effects. Prayer does work!

Requests were: Sandy's continued arthritis suffering due to the weather; Jim's 79th birthday (no permanent full retirement for them!), a deaf friend undergoing chemotherapy, prayers for ministry and governmental leaders, prayer for ministries and ministry workers during the pandemic, especially missionaries around the world.

There's also a touching story about how God uses and continues to use a sacrificial gift from the heart long after the giver has left this earth. Don't be overcome with the problems of the world, but be transformed!

January 2021 from Baptist Church Planters:

As we begin 2021 we pause to reflect on God's goodness and provision in 2020. We are reminded that gifts given are often multiplied far beyond our limited view. Much as Jesus divided the loaves and fish, He multiples your generosity.

Story from a missionary in Tracy, California:

When we were on deputation heading into a church planting ministry, we arrived at a church flat broke. It was a tiny church with only a handful of people. At offering time, we heard a young boy about nine years old in the pew behind us drop a few coins in the offering plate, whispering loudly to his grandmother, "It's all I've got, but they can have it." Our weary hearts were moved as we were convicted of our shortsighted vision. We prayed that God would somehow multiply that little boy's loaves and fish. That offering paid all the bills for that month and put gas in our car. But God was not done multiplying the boy's loaves and fish. That church soon closed and sold their building to another gospel-preaching ministry. The proceeds were invested in several missionaries, including us, helping us start a church. God is still not done! In 2020, that church took on a project started by a 4-year-old missionary kid in Peru to provide Christmas for children in the slums of Peru. Nine-year-old Zechariah who had been saved the year before (2019) wanted to give what he had to the children in need. He gathered his family's recycling as a Christmas offering for that project. Word of his gift spread through the church and community--other people started donating their recycling for his offering. God has turned his pocket change into hundreds of dollars to spread the gospel to children in another country.
