Chinese Bible Mission (CBM) is one of the organizations supported by our Great Commission Fund. CBM is the founder of Chinese Bible Church (now BACBC).



China Ministry: CBM planted its first church in China three years ago, and it is now completely financially self-sufficient, with many leaders within the church to preach and teach. It has expanded to 2 locations with one near the university district and has 40-60 attendees weekly (about the max we can have safely). The church itself has also



started to fund other church plants, and our CBM staff is hoping to lead outreach to the minorities in Yunnan and Xinjiang. We are currently recruiting prayer & financial partners to be the "Angel Investors" for these two church plants! 
t is with a heavy and discordant heart that I am writing this newsletter. I am saddened by the displace-

ment of families and deaths of innocent people in Ukraine because of the unprovoked war by Russia. We once again witness the sufferings of humanity over the cause of history because of certain political agenda. There is really no proper transition or commentary to justify my updating of my mission work at this time, except to point out a new development for your prayerful consideration.

On March 2, I started a new "Marriage and Family" class. As I logged in to my teaching app, I noticed that I am only able to see their names but not their faces. I later found out that China's new internet regulations went into effect on March 1, laying out broad restrictions on religious communication, teach-

ing, and evangelism. The new rules perhaps have caused some people to conceal their identities. Amazingly, more than 90 people showed up on the first day of class! Again, the hunger for truth is an inspiration to me to carry on the mission work from the traditional mission model to the "internet" model.

The new regulations were announced at the end of last year by China's State Administration of Religious Affairs (SARA) and allow only religious groups with government approval to share information on the internet. According to the new Measures on the Administration of Internet Religious Information Services: Organizations and individuals must not proselytize online and must not carry out religious education or training, publish preaching, or repost or link to related content; must not organize the carrying out of religious activities online; and must not broadcast religious rites ... through means such as text, imThe biggest

ages, audio, or video either live or in recordings.

On February 28, the Chinese government issued a press release answering questions about the new regulation and saying that the government "will have close and thorough cooperation to ensure the implementation of the measures." (CT Asia)

Mission work in religiously persecuted countries has always been a challenge. At the beginning of my mission work, I have to learn how to navigate through many different physical restraints. Then came the Pandemic. The biggest challenge for me from the pandemic is the elimination of face-to-face interaction with my students. To me, it was vital in the counseling training program. However, over the past two years, I have accepted the "New Norm" of instruction and became an "Internet Missionary".

With this internet new regulation in place, please pray that I am still able to continue in this new mission field in a more effective manner.

Having said that, the pandemic has increased the time I have to communicate on the internet in different time zones and cities at the same time. I will continue to teach, encourage and mentor more leaders until I am blocked or the platforms are no longer available.

With this internet new regulation in place, please pray that I am still able to continue in this new mission field in a more effective manner. I have scheduled a new semester next month in another city, where the persecution is known to be more zealous. Pray that God will bring the people to be trained as future faithful leaders and please pray that the students will be protected whenever they are "online". Φ
