F & K, creative access community

From today's bulletin / Missions Report from Missions Team

F & K have been teaching Bible classes at two colleges. F also teaches Hebrew and Greek while K teaches English at an Islamic University as well. In addition, F preaches and shares in chapels. They provided homestays to groups of Muslim high school teachers and students. Their ministry also includes counseling and mentoring students.

In the last year, they were in the US in July to reconnect with their supporters. In August through November, they ministered in two seminaries teaching five different classes of Greek, Hebrew, Counseling, English and Islam. K had an opportunity to speak at an Islamic conference. F preached in several local churches. They continue to train students in how to reach into the lives of Muslims. They outreach to young Muslims and counsel students there in the village where they live. K had knee surgery in December and is almost completely recovered with so

During one Bible study session, the local believers asked, "What are you thankful to God for?" The Fulani group members responded with an outpouring of gratitude to the one true God for the provision of water.

Dear Friends at Bay Area Chinese Bible Church,

When God calls a Pioneers family to serve among unreached people groups, He calls their children to be Third Culture Kids (TCKs). Children who grow up outside of their passport country have both exhilarating and challenging experiences, often at the same time. They enjoy some wonderful privileges and face some unique difficulties.

TCKs are well equipped to make a significant contribution to reaching the unreached. In fact, approximately one-fifth of Pioneers missionaries are TCKs themselves. Research has shown that one of the most critical times to support TCKs is when they transition from their overseas location to college in the U.S.

Typically, a TCK's passport country feels foreign to them, and for the first time they are separated from their family members who remain overseas. One way Pioneers helps our TCKs transition well is by providing financial support through the Pioneers College Scholarship Fund. This is a great encouragement for students as they navigate life in the U.S.

Dear Friends at Bay Area Chinese Bible Church,

Thank you for your generous giving to Pioneers and our missionaries!

Because of donors like you, Pioneers Media Outreach teams have been able to connect online with unreached people groups in places like Bosnia, Nepal, Indonesia and throughout the Arab world. Every week our media teams see people they met on the internet come to faith!

In Nepal specifically, Pioneers Media Outreach is being led by *Tom, a Nepali missionary skilled in digital media strategies. Tom was born and raised in a rural village in Western Nepal. By the grace of God, he believed at an early age, and God used him to bring saving faith to his three brothers and some of his relatives and friends. His home village now has a fellowship of believers, and they desire to reach all of Nepal with the gospel.

God is using Tom as the first Nepali Pioneers missionary to lead media initiatives that will reach other Nepalis. In the last 12 months, 484 people have come to faith— an average of more than one person per day!

Would you help more missionaries like Tom use digital media to engage some of the hardest-toreach communities? When you give to Pioneers Media Outreach, you are providing missionaries the opportunity to receive coaching in digital strategies and supporting the digital content they create to connect with spiritually open seekers. On average, for every \$30 donated to Pioneers Media Outreach, 6 seekers engage with digital ads and start spiritual conversations with missionaries and their partners. One of our partners has offered to match up to \$20,000 for missionaries to receive coaching in media outreach strategies.
