July 2022 Missions Report

Global Gates (West Coast, US) – Jason Brown replaced Tim Fortescue last year as the Director of Global Gates, West Coast. One of the projects that Jason set up was collaborating with local Afghan families and several churches in San Ramon, CA to put together kitchen kits for newly arriving Afghan refugee families. Each kit costs \$900 and they have put together 30 kits! This year, Jason's family took an Afghan family to Target to get their kitchen set. They were able to share with this Afghan family the story of Jesus and Easter. Our prayers are asked for this family's salvation. For an Easter outreach event, 6,000 plastic Easter eggs were filled with candy and 250 Afghan kids participated in multiple egg hunts. About 500 Afghans along with over 70 volunteers from 16 churches attended the event. A team of 24 surveyed over 10 apartment complexes in Fremont and Union City in March to find out where and how they can connect with Afghan families.

January 2022 Missions Report

Global Gates (West Coast, US) – The takeover of Kabul in Afghanistan provided a great opportunity for the local (Bay Area) Afghan Church pastor to reach out to new arrivals. This ministry is continuing to thrive. Besides regular outreach events, during Thanksgiving and Christmas gifts were provided to families along with a copy of the gospel. Though now living in Wisconsin, Tim Fortescue is continuing to network with folks interested in ministry to Afghans and connecting them with the ministry in the Bay Area. Additionally, he has been able to make some connections with the new arrivals here as well as those in Wisconsin. Tim is putting more focus on organizational fundraising and as a result, Global Gates ended 2021 financially healthy. He is thankful for BACBC's continued partnership with them.

From the Fortescues

Dear Friends @ BACBC

we're so grateful for your Partnership)

Greetings from Wisconsin! It's hard to find the words to begin this end of the year check-in. It's been a lot folks, it's been a lot...

We left California at the end of August and arrived in Wisconsin a week later, excited, confident, and expecting that we'd be staying with Tessa's mom, Mary, for a few weeks before buying a place in our new hometown of Mount

Horeb, outside of Madison. Almost four months later, we're still living with Mary (bless her) in Monroe, driving the kids to school about 35 minutes away, and the real estate market has all but shuttered its windows until spring. Initially, transitioning to new schools was a little rocky, culture shock was a bit more than we'd anticipated, as were the unexpected pangs of sadness for aspects of our life in California that we'd left behind. It has felt like a prolonged Advent of sorts.

Waiting...not knowing how things will unfold and trying to trust that God is with us in this season of transition. And, while we wait, there is also the sweetness of regularly seeing Tessa's mom and dad, sister and brother-in-law, the kids' cousins, and other relatives and friends. There is the gift of a supportive community of people who've known us for years and who love us. There is the beauty of vast sunsets and star-filled night

skies unblocked by cityscape, rolling hills, oak groves, and space to



really exhale. There is so much goodness and sweetness in being here, even as we process so many changes.

During this season of Advent, we've been thinking about Mary (the mother of Jesus, not the mother of Tessa,) who had her own season of waiting that we can only imagine must have been filled with doubt, fear, and ultimately, her surrender to God. It's written in Luke that the angel reminded her "The Lord is with you" and, "Be not afraid", and then, Mary answered "Yes". She jumped off a cultural cliff and was taken on a journey she could have never imagined. She bore and raised the Prince of Peace, who showed us what God looks like and who taught us how to live in love--not fear.

As our country becomes more divided and more uncertain, Tessa and I cling to these messages of hope that were given to Mary in a similarly dark time. *The Lord is with you. Be not afraid.* And when we steep ourselves in this place of Christ-with-us and this knowledge that God cares for us, there's a little more ease, a little more ability to see and participate in the kingdom of God, right here and now (which, if we're honest, doesn't always feel triumphant or confident...it can feel like Mary...young and shaky, and it can be mixed with doubt and grief.)

While we moved to Wisconsin of our own accord, thousands of desperate Afghan refugees were being transferred here at the same time. Many with only the clothes they were wearing when they fled their country. When we updated you in October, I was settling into my work in organizational development and fundraising with Global Gates as well as networking with others to partner with Afghan ministries in the Bay Area and throughout the country. I continue this work as churches reach out to me, desiring to come alongside Afghan refugees here in Wisconsin as well as in California. Another project I've spent considerable time on in my development role was getting Global Gates vetted by an organization that works with donors who annually give generously to many ministries. I applied for a

\$200,000 grant from one of their clients and we're thankful to say that Global Gates passed the vetting process and was granted the funds. One way this grant will be used is to subsidize funding for our ethnic partners, (such as Afghan, Iranian and West African Christians in ministry who may face more challenges with fund-raising due to language barriers and/or a more limited network of supporters.) They can also be put towards community crisis funds (ie. assisting recent Afghan refugees) as we try to be the hands and feet of Jesus. Lastly, these funds can also be put towards starting a retirement fund for Global Gates personnel, as many do not have the capacity to do this on their own.

During this time of transition, it's been orienting to have the consistency of this meaningful work, even as there are so many other changes happening around us. It's also been a sobering reminder that our upheaval was our choice. We weren't fleeing a violent regime or fearing for our daughters' safety. We ask for your continued prayer for the people of Afghanistan; that they would experience Christ's healing in their hearts, and for justice and peace in their homeland.



In closing, may the words offered to a frightened young girl in Nazareth some two millennia ago take root in our own hearts; *The Lord is with you. Be not afraid.* And may we--moment to moment and day by day--find a way to our own "*Yes*". *Yes*, to the way of the Lord...humble, gentle, patient, forgiving, and compassionate. *Yes*, to loving and caring for our neighbors as ourselves. *Yes*, to actively looking for and rejoicing in goodness and beauty, while making space to grieve all that is broken. A *yes* that allows us to surrender and trust that we are in the hands of a loving God. And *yes* to whatever helps us root ourselves in the peace of Christ.

The Lord is with thee! Fear not ...

Tessa and I are so thankful for your prayers and support.

Dear Ministry Partner,

Moving to Multiplication

Dear Ministry Partner,

Your Global Gates missionaries have responded to the Afghan refugee crisis with a passion, love, and steadfast spirit that only God can give. I'm delighted to have one of them share about what God is doing among Afghans:

A new chapter began in the gateway city I serve in three months after Kabul fell to the Taliban. Afghan refugees began to pour in. More than 5,000 Afghan refugees arrived within a few months. This overwhelmed resettlement agencies, systems, resources, and many laborers.

There were weeks where we worked 12 to 16-hour days, sometimes six days a week, feeding, clothing, and demonstrating the love of Christ to Afghans in need. These refugees were hurting, scared, and hungry, and our team along with the larger body of Christ rose up and met the challenge. God brought some dear brothers and sisters to this city. Yet, they too were refugees, experiencing the same things as all the others. Our team was blessed to connect with them before they arrived and were prepared to welcome them.

We're excited to report that several families are now gathering as a church. Our team began training them in Disciple Making Movements, and they're now sharing Jesus with other Afghans. We baptized one Afghan, and have two Discovery Bible Study groups going. Please pray for the Afghan church in this gateway city and around the world. To God be the glory.
