Prayer Requests from CBM

From today's bulletin:

We received these prayer requests from CBM this week:

- 1. Praise for completion of an online classes (Grief Counseling, Marriage & Family); more than 65 students completed the courses.
- 2. Prayer for Summer Short term Mission ministries in Taiwan during the month of July: working with 100 children in an elementary school kids summer camp registered through the CBM church plant. Some of the children attending are from a local orphanage. Several young adults from the US are helping with this opportunity. We are using the Bible to teach English to the children and at the same time reaching out to the parents who are dropping off and picking up the kids by inviting them to our parents' discussion groups. Religion in Taiwan are Buddhism (35.1%), Taoism (33.0%), No religion (18.7%), and Christianity (3.9%). There are about 100 kids who are already registered for the camp. Please pray that this summer outreach ministry will be able to reach out to more families to come to know Jesus and have a personal relationship with Him as their own personal Lord and Savior. There is also another project after the camp. Seven of us will remain in Taiwan to help refurbish a building for a newly setup Christian Counseling Center. None of us are professional construction workers. We will clean, paint and do minor repairs. Pray that both projects will result in many more having a growing relationship with Jesus!
- 3. Prayer for our brothers and sisters in a closed creative access area who have been subject to persecution by their local authorities including house arrest. As we celebrate July 4th in America, please remember to pray for my students. One of them was recently placed under house arrest. All family



communications, social medias and physical locations are closely monitored. Another student had his internet service abruptly canceled. He then had to find another internet service provider to continue in his training. But the encouraging news is that their faith remains rooted in Christ Jesus, our Lord and Savior.
